## The Treasure Principle

"The Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure that a man discovered hidden in a field. In his excitement, he hid it again and sold everything he owned to get enough money to buy the field.

"Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. WHAT IS THIS TREASURE WE WILL BE STORING UP?

The crowd was listening to everything Jesus said. And because he was nearing Jerusalem, he told them a story to correct the impression that the Kingdom of God would begin right away. <sup>12</sup> He said, "A nobleman was called away to a distant empire to be crowned king and then return. <sup>13</sup> Before he left, he called together ten of his servants and divided among them ten pounds of silver, <sup>[5]</sup> saying, 'Invest this for me while I am gone.' <sup>14</sup> But his people hated him and sent a delegation after him to say, 'We do not want him to be our king.'
